## Montclair State University Federation of Teachers <br> Local 1904, American Federation of Teachers, AFL-CIO CONSTITUTION

## ARTICLE I. NAME

Section 1. This organization shall be known as the American Federation of Teachers, Local 1904, AFL-CIO.

Section 2. Hereinafter this organization shall be referred to as AFT Local 1904.
ARTICLE II. GUIDING PRINCIPLES
Section 1. To promote the unionization of faculty, professional staff, librarians, and clinical/instructional specialists, and other employees of Montclair State University.

Section 2. To participate in Statewide negotiations and conduct Local negotiations on terms and conditions of employment and to otherwise represent full-time and part-time faculty, professional staff, and librarians at Montclair State University.

Section 3. To protect the rights and privileges of full-time and part-time faculty, professional staff, and librarians at Montclair State University by securing the conditions necessary to facilitate the provision of highquality professional services.

Section 4. To work toward the overall collective good of our members through vigorous advocacy, representation and contract enforcement. This shall be achieved through grievance processing and enforcing state-wide and local policies and practices that AFT Local 1904 has been instrumental in crafting.

Section 5. To advocate for the enhancement of and access to quality education at Montclair State University.

Section 6. To remain vigilant and proactive on social justice issues impacting quality of life and access to public education in New Jersey, as well as the ways in which these social justice issues enhance the terms and conditions of employment at Montclair State University.

Section 7. To support and cooperate with organized labor and the labor movement to promote a quality educational experience at Montclair State University and other higher education and PreK-12 educational institutions throughout New Jersey, the nation and beyond.

## ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership is open to all full-time and part-time faculty, professional
staff, librarians, clinical/instructional specialists, as well as any other employees in the bargaining unit represented by the Local at Montclair State University. Adjunct faculty are not eligible for membership of AFT Local 1904 except as members of the retiree group.

Section 2. AFT Local 1904 is open to all and there shall be no discrimination on the basis of gender, race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, age, disability, gender identity, marital status, domestic partnership or political belief pertaining to any aspect of the policies, procedures and practices of AFT Local 1904.

## ARTICLE IV. OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. AFT Local 1904 shall have the following 14 elected officers which will constitute the Officers Group: a President, a Vice-President for Internal Affairs, a Vice-President for External Affairs, a Vice-President for Negotiations (Chief Negotiator), a Vice-President for Personnel (Grievance Officer), a Treasurer, a Recording Secretary, a Faculty Coordinator, a Faculty Negotiator, a Professional Staff Coordinator, a Professional Staff Negotiator, a Librarian Coordinator, a Specialist Coordinator, and an Organizing Coordinator. A Montclair State University Senate Liaison between AFT Local 1904 and the Montclair State University Senate will be appointed by consensus of the elected officers, in coordination with the University Senate.

Section 2. The term of office for each elected officer shall be two years. The Officers shall begin their term of office on May 1st after their election and shall serve until the 30th day of April after the next election unless they have resigned, retired or have been recalled.

Section 3. Officers shall be elected by a majority of the voters in a secret ballot conducted in even-numbered years during the Spring semester. For any office, if no majority is obtained on a first-ballot, a run-off election shall be held between the two candidates with the highest vote. Such run-off elections shall also be conducted by secret ballot.

Section 4. The Elections Committee, consisting of three members and approved by the Executive Board, shall conduct elections of all officers. Appointed by the President, the elections committee shall present a slate of candidates at the March Membership Meeting of evennumbered years. Nominations from the floor may also be made at the Membership Meeting at which the Elections Committee presents its nominations. There shall be no write-in options on the ballot.

Section 5. If an officer or representative resigns or retires during their term of office, a replacement shall be elected by means of timely election.

Section 6. Election to AFT Local 1904 office requires that all nominees for office
must be members of AFT Local 1904 in good standing at the time of nomination.

Section 7. Delegates to the Council of New Jersey State College Locals shall be elected at the same election as all the officers above. The number shall be based on membership as prescribed by the Constitution of the Council of New Jersey State College Locals. The President and VicePresident for External Affairs serve as Council Delegates, ex-officio. All nominees for office must be members of AFT Local 1904 in good standing at the time of nomination.

## ARTICLE V. THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of Officers, State Council Delegates, Negotiation Team members, Grievance Committee members, Audit and Finance Committee members and Stewards. The President with the approval of the Officers shall appoint other Executive Board members if the need arises.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall review the budget, policies and direction of AFT Local1904 as set by officers and the membership at regular meetings. It shall have the power to act in emergency situations where the policy cannot be set by the membership. A quorum of the Executive Board shall consist of 15 members.

Section 3 The Executive Board will meet twice yearly, once in the Fall and once in the Spring. The Executive Board may have additional meetings as required. Executive Board meetings are called and arranged by the Vice-President for Internal Affairs.

Section 4. The chairperson of the Executive Board shall be the AFT Local1904 Vice-President for Internal Affairs.

Section 5. The Executive Board does not have the power to expend funds or employ personnel but can make recommendations to the Officers for consideration and implementation.

Section 6. The Executive Board shall publish its minutes and present as appropriate at Membership Meetings.

## ARTICLE VI. COMMITTEES

Section 1. The following shall be the Standing Committees of AFT Local1904: State Council Delegates, Grievance Committee, COPE Committee, Recruitment and Membership Committee, Negotiations Team, Elections Committee, Audit Committee, and Finance Committee._Other standing committees may be created by the officers and approved by the membership as appropriate.

Section 2. All members of AFT Local 1904 in good standing are eligible to serve on committees. The President, subject to approval by the Executive Board, shall appoint chairpersons of committees.

ARTICLE VII. MEETINGS

Section 1. Membership Meetings are set by the "Dates Reserved for Meetings" as generated by the Provost's office in consultation with the AFT Local 1904. The President shall determine the time and place of meetings.

Section 2. The President can call a Special Membership Meeting, with the approval of the Officers, when the need arises outside of the regular published dates and/or times.

Section 3. There shall be at least six regular membership meetings and two Executive Board meetings during the regular academic year. The Officers will meet regularly.

Section 4. Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, governs the conduct in all Officer, Executive Board and Membership Meetings and takes precedence where this constitution and/or bylaws are silent on a particular governance issue.

ARTICLE VIII. AFFILIATIONS
Section 1. AFT Local 1904 shall maintain affiliation with the following organizations:
a. AFT National and participates at the AFT National Convention by sending the President and Vice-President for External Affairs on alternating years when the convention is held. Council delegates serve ex-officio as national convention delegates but are sent to the national convention only at the approval of the Officers when appropriate and there are available funds to do so.
b. The Council of New Jersey State College Locals (CNJSCL), AFL-CIO. AFT Local 1904 shall maintain full and current membership in the Council.
c. The American Federation of Teachers New Jersey (AFT NJ).
d. The Essex-West Hudson Labor Council
e. The New Jersey AFL-CIO
f. Other organizations, as deemed appropriate by the Officers and Executive Board.

Section 2. Every reasonable effort shall be made by AFT Local 1904 to pay the actual expenses of delegates and/or representatives to meetings and conventions of affiliated organizations.

Section 3. Delegates to affiliated organizations shall be members of AFT Local 1904 in good standing.

ARTICLE IX. DUES and FINANCES

Section 1. The amount and manner of payment of dues shall be specified in the Bylaws. Any modification of the amount and/or manner of payment of dues shall be enacted by a modification of the Bylaws according to established procedures for same.

Section 2. Additional finances may be obtained through interest bearing deposits, investments as advised by the Finance Committee and by various fundraising activities including but not limited to advertisements on the Local's webpage, newsletters and other published documents.

## ARTICLE X. AMENDMENTS

Section 1. Amendments to this Constitution and/or the Bylaws may be initiated by the Vice-President for Internal Affairs, in consultation with the Officers. Proposed amendments shall be presented for a first reading at a regularly scheduled AFT Local 1904 Membership Meeting (Membership Meeting). Additionally, any member in good standing may propose amendments to this Constitution and/or the Bylaws at a Membership Meeting. If such proposed amendments are accepted by the vote of a majority of members present, a first reading of these proposed amendments shall be held at the next Membership Meeting. Following a first reading, the proposed amendments will be sent via email to the Membership, as well as posted on the AFT Local 1904 website, at least ten (10) working days prior to the subsequent Membership Meeting. At the subsequent Membership Meeting, there shall be a second reading, followed by a vote on the proposed amendments, at that meeting. A two-thirds majority vote of all members present at the Meeting shall be sufficient for adoption. If any member calls for a secret ballot, that request shall be honored.
