Memorandum of Agreement between Montclair State University (the University) and AFT Local 1904 (the Local) regarding Mental-Health First-Aid Training for Faculty

The Executive Director of the Office for Faculty Excellence (OFE) intends to implement a Mental-Health First-Aid Training for Faculty. The University and the Local agree to the following terms and conditions for the implementation of the Mental-Health First-Aid Training Program:

1. Eligibility

instructional and clinical specialists, tenured and tenure-track Faculty members

2. Selection

Invitation will go first to instructional and clinical specialists and probationary faculty; second to associate professors; and third to full professors. Allotted seats will be given out on a first-come first-serve basis.

3. Procedures

- a. The Executive Director of OFE will invite commitments to attend the training no less than thirty (30) days before the training is scheduled. Invitations will be sent by email with a link to an events registration Web page.
- b. There are no application materials required.
- c. Successful registration will be confirmed by e-mail, confirming the individual's inclusion in the program.
- d. When all the spots are full, registration will close. A wait list will be maintained should a registrant be unable to attend.
- e. The events registration confirmation will confirm that the participant will be paid a \$250 honorarium upon attendance of the full training event.
- f. In the event that an individual becomes unavailable to attend the training, it is that person's responsibility to cancel the registration with no penalty.
- g. The number of applications accepted in response to any solicitation shall be at the discretion of the Executive Director, but will be approximately thirty (30) total attendees.

4. Mental-Health First-Aid Training

- a. The training will be offered as an 8-hour in-person session under the direction of Student Development and Campus Life.
- b. The training will occur on campus and lunch will be provided.
- c. Participants are expected to attend the entire training session.
- d. Participation in the training is voluntary and there shall be no written evaluation of an individual's participation.

5. Compensation

A \$250 honorarium will be provided upon completion of the training. The payment will be made after the event has concluded as supplemental payment, processed by the Office for Faculty Excellence.

6. Program Continuation

Based on feedback from participants, the program will be evaluated and continued only if additional funds become available. Otherwise the program will cease.

7. This Agreement does not otherwise alter nor supersede other agreements between the State of NJ and the Council of NJ State College Locals, nor any agreements between Montclair State University and AFT Local 1904, including the Local Selected Procedures Agreement.
